PAULA SCHAEFER Clarion Partners WX, New York Women Executives in Real Estate, is an invitation-only association of more than 200 senior level women representing all aspects of the commercial real estate industry, from owners, developers and private equity professionals to lawyers, architects, bankers, brokers and engineers.

The WX Scholars Program is an initiative of the WX Charitable Fund, Ltd. Its goal is to encourage and support bright and talented young women pursuing challenging careers in real estate and related professions in the New York metropolitan area. Since the program was launched in 2004, scholarships have been awarded to over 245 women at 14 schools totaling approximately \$1.14 million.

There are numerous benefits to a WX Scholarship, including participation in the WX Mentoring Program, which matches recipients with WX mentors, as well as no-cost admission for up to three years to many WX-hosted events, such as monthly breakfasts and the annual dinner. These activities develop productive relationships and offer networking opportunities to support recipients as they enter the workforce. In addition, applicants in need of financial assistance may receive a monetary scholarship to help offset tuition costs.

Scholarships are awarded on an annual basis to students studying real estate and related subjects, such as architecture, law and engineering among others, at the graduate or undergraduate levels. Applicants must be in their final year of required coursework for the degree and/or major and enrolled in the school during the full 2017/2018 academic year to receive a scholarship. Award criteria is based on i) academic merit; ii) a demonstrated interest in real estate through courses, clubs, internships and experience; and iii) a high likelihood of working in the New York metropolitan area upon graduation.

Participating schools include Columbia University, New York University, Baruch College, New York Law School, The City College of New York (CCNY), Pratt Institute, Rutgers University, University of Pennsylvania, Georgetown University, Lehigh University, Yale University, Harvard University, Cornell University, and Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT).

Applications will be accepted between November 27, 2017 and February 23, 2018. Scholarship Committee members will interview finalists in March 2018 in person or via telephone as required, and scholarships will be awarded in April 2018.

WX SCHOLARS PROGRAM BENEFITS

The WX Scholars Program helps pave the way for the next generation of women in the commercial real estate industry. Scholars benefit from a forum for visibility and exchange with leading female executives in New York's dynamic real estate industry.

Scholars are also invited to a number of WX events and will be hosted by members of the WX Scholarship Committee.

- Mentoring WX is now in its seventh year of the Mentoring Program, specifically designed to match up recipients with WX mentors and provide them with specific programs and hopefully, productive relationships and networking opportunities as they enter the workforce. Through formal programs and both formal and informal mentoring, WX aims to provide young women in the real estate industry an opportunity to leverage the knowledge and experience of WX members as they begin their real estate careers. All WX scholarship recipients are eligible to participate in the structured program for two years.
- Monthly Breakfasts WX holds monthly breakfast meetings for members and invited guests. A distinguished speaker or panel in the field of real estate or related topic is showcased. Scholarship recipients are invited to attend as guests for up to three years after being selected.
- Conversations & Perspectives Events that provide a unique opportunity for female students and junior professionals interested in real estate to converse with the leading female executives in New York's dynamic real estate industry. Previous topics have included: "Green" is Money; Private Equity Perspectives; NY State of Mind Real Estate Trends in New York City; A Survival Handbook Career Strategies for Women in Real Estate; and Hurricane Sandy and Rising Currents. Scholarship recipients are invited to attend as free guests for up to three years after being selected.
- **Financial Assistance** Applicants can apply for up to \$10,000 of financial assistance to offset tuition costs.
- WX Annual Dinner An allotted number of seats are reserved for scholarship recipients for an opportunity to meet and network with a broader section of commercial real estate population within New York City. Scholarship recipients are eligible for this benefit for up to five years after being selected. Tickets for the first two years are complimentary and at a discounted rate for three years afterwards.

Application Materials WX SCHOLARS PROGRAM 2017/2018 Academic Year General Information for Applicants

Eligibility:	WX awards scholarships on an annual basis to promising women students studying real estate at the undergraduate and graduate levels. Students must be enrolled in school during the full 2017/2018 academic year. The criteria we use in awarding scholarships are as follows: i) academic merit; ii) a demonstrated interest in real estate through courses, clubs, internships and experience; and iii) a high likelihood of working in the New York metropolitan area upon graduation. Candidates who meet the above criteria and have applied previously, but have not received an award may reapply. Students applying to the Scholars Program must be in their final year of studies, having a graduation date that falls between May 2018 to	
	February 2019. There is a maximum one award per student; previous recipients will not receive additional awards.	
	Consistent with WX's mission of promoting the advancement of women in the New York City real estate industry, the Scholars Program is limited to U.S. citizens and permanent residents.	
Scholarship Amount:	Recipients can apply for a financial award based on demonstrated financial need. Scholarship award amounts range and may be awarded up to \$10,000 for each recipient.	
	Financial awards are made by check directly to the school (i.e. bursar's office), not to the student herself.	
Application Materials:	A description of all required application materials is attached.	
Deadline for Submitting	Applications will be accepted between November 27, 2017 and February 23, 2018. <i>Late and incomplete applications will not be accepted or considered.</i>	
Application:	The deadline for submission of applications is 5pm on February 23, 2018. Applications should be mailed or emailed to the contact below. Candidates may be asked to meet with the WX Scholarship Committee in March 2018.

WX SCHOLARS PROGRAM 2017/2018 Academic Year

WX (New York Women Executives in Real Estate) is pleased to offer scholarships to women in specified graduate or undergraduate real estate-related programs. Applicants must be in their final year of required coursework for their degree. Each scholarship will be awarded to a student who demonstrates academic excellence, a strong interest in real estate through courses, clubs, internships, and work experience, and a high likelihood of working in the New York City metropolitan area upon graduation.

The WX Scholarship Committee will evaluate student applicants who are nominated by their faculty, and designate the recipients.

Applications must include the following:

- 1. **Essay**. An essay, not to exceed one typewritten page. The student will identify her degree program, and discuss her career expectations and how past and present work experience and education have contributed to her planned career path. The essay should include a statement explaining why the student feels that the scholarship should be awarded to her.
- 2. **Description of the Major and/or Degree Program.** The application should include a description of the requirements of the degree including required and elective course offerings.
- 3. **Transcripts**. Grade point average for coursework in the current program as well as previous undergraduate and graduate work (as applicable). Please include copies of graduate (as applicable) and undergraduate transcripts.
- 4. **Faculty Recommendation**. A letter of recommendation from a member of the faculty of the applicant's program.
- 5. **Second Recommendation**. A second letter of recommendation from either an employer or a second faculty member.
- 6. **Resume**. A current resume.
- 7. **Financial Statement**. The student can apply for financial assistance. If applying for financial assistance, she should state so in her essay, and include a completed and certified Personal Financial Statement (see attachment).
- 8. Interview. A personal interview with WX members will be required.

Applicants must be United States citizens and permanent residents.

WX will accept applications between November 27, 2017 and February 23, 2018. The deadline for submissions of applications is 5:00 PM on February 23, 2018. Late and incomplete applications will **not** be accepted or considered. Applicants will be notified of scholarship decisions in April 2018.
