WX HOSTS ITS ANNUAL MENTORING CAREER PANEL NIGHT

WX New York Women Executives in Real Estate (WX) hosted its 3rd Annual Career Night for professional women who have earned the WX Scholars designation and are participating in the 2018-19 WX Mentoring Program. This event, which has become a core offering of the WX Mentoring Program, introduces young women who are starting out in their careers in various sectors of the real estate industry. The event was hosted at the offices of JPMorgan in New York City on Wednesday, January 23, 2019.

Event Overview

The WX Career Night is designed to provide attendees with the opportunity to explore various careers across real estate sectors and have the opportunity to learn from industry leaders who are experts in their field. Participants attended panels led by WX members working in the areas of Investment Management, Capital Markets, Development, and Construction/ Design /Architecture. The panelists offered practical advice for succeeding in their respective fields, information about education, training and career paths, as well as personal anecdotes and notable experiences.

Development Panel

The Development Panel, led by Lauren Sanders of Midwood Investment and Development, discussed the type of education and skills junior level associates are expected to have prior to starting their role and what a day in the life of a development professional looks like. Panelists, all WX members, were Jennifer McCool of Related Companies, Megumi Brod of Rockefeller Group, and Veronica Hackett of The Clarett Group.

Investment Management Panel

The Investment Management Panel, led by Lesley Lisser of Invesco Real Estate, focused on various career paths within the broad area of real estate investment management, including desired education and training for optimum results. Each panelist shared personal stories about their path to success and what helped them get where they are today. Dana Roffman of Angelo Gordon, Sara Queen of Mapletree US Management, LLC, and Alice Cao of JP Morgan Asset Management spoke on this year's panel.

Capital Markets Panel

The Capital Markets Panel, led by **Deborah Ginsberg** of **TPG Real Estate Finance**, covered another broad sector of the real estate industry. Participants learned about the various segments of this sector, and what type of personalities and character traits work well in those spaces. Panelists discussed challenges

as well as advantages of working in this area. Amy Applebaum, a Fund Finance Consultant, Amy Johannes of Oaktree Capital, Caroline Mahl of Wells Fargo Bank N.A. and June Munshi of The CenterCap Group LLC rounded out this panel.

Construction/ Design / Architecture Panel
