Since its founding in 2016, Project Destined has worked with more than 3,500 participants in 35 cities across the U.S., Canada, United Kingdom and Europe. WX's partnership will support Project Destined and its mission to provide training in financial literacy, entrepreneurship, and real estate to students from underserved communities.

As the first all-female Project Destined team in New York City, our WX Members and WX Scholars will also enhance the public perception of the role of women within the industry and promote the highest standards of professionalism, ethics and integrity in the field, in line with WX's mission. Project Destined leverages a work-based learning approach where students join executives to evaluate actual commercial real estate deals in their community and compete in a pitch competition to industry leaders to earn scholarships. WX's mentors will prepare, engage, and guide students one-on-one to help them develop a range of fundamentals—including financial, technical, presentation, and leadership skills—designed to aid them in obtaining internships, certifications, and full-time employment, launching their careers in commercial real estate.

"We are thrilled to partner with WX to launch our first all-female cohort in New York City." said Cedric Bobo, Co-Founder of Project Destined. "The real estate industry provides incredible opportunities to build a great career and impact your community. We are excited to partner with WX to ensure these young women are ready to take on that opportunity."

WX is well aware of the importance of investing in future generations, as WX launched a Scholars Program in 2004 to promote and support bright, talented young women pursuing careers in real estate and related professions in the New York metropolitan area. Since the program launched, scholarships have been awarded to 383 women at 18 schools, with scholarship value totaling more than \$1.85 million. Scholars have the opportunity to network with WX members, attend selected WX-hosted events, and participate in the WX Mentoring Program for two years.
